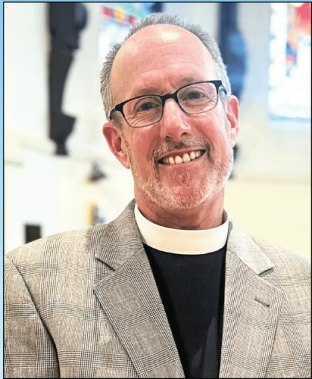

***How Knowing the History of Mother's Day Can Equip Us to Meet the Challenges of the Moment* with Susan Russell**



We will revisit the original inspiration behind Mother's Day — the Mother's Day Proclamation powerfully articulated by Julia Ward Howe in the aftermath of the American Civil War — and how it still speaks with urgency in 2026, calling us to resist the normalization of violence and to claim our moral agency in shaping a more compassionate world. Howe's vision of mothers united across borders, refusing to allow their children to be sacrificed to war, resonates in this moment marked by ongoing conflict, political polarization, and global instability. Her proclamation challenges us not only to honor motherhood sentimentally, but to embrace its prophetic dimension: a fierce commitment to peace, justice, and the protection of human dignity. In a time when the voices of conscience are often drowned out by fear and division, the spirit of that proclamation invites us—across generations and identities—to gather, to grieve, and to act for the sake of a more just and peaceful future.

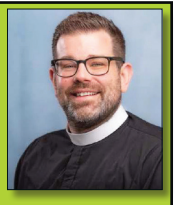

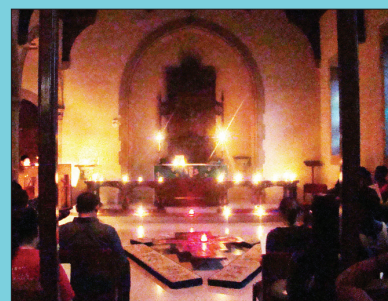

This builds a sense of community, and helps the writers to become more confident in their work.

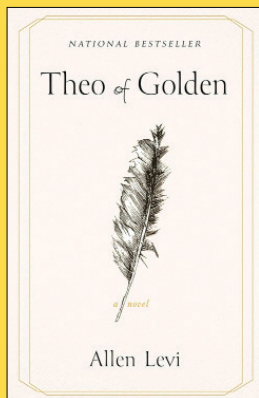

Fiction Fun! Reads *Theo of Golden* by Allen Levi

This novel, self-published by its author in 2023, got traditionally published two years later and became a *New York Times* #1 best-seller, with a million copies sold by March 2026. May Jazz Vespers: Anthony Wilson

Born in Los Angeles in 1968, guitarist and composer Anthony Wilson is known for a body of work that moves fluidly across genres. The son of legendary jazz trumpeter and bandleader Gerald Wilson, his musical lineage has deeply influenced his creative trajectory, compositional choices, instrumental groupings, and the wide-ranging discography that blooms out of them. An inventive soloist and sensitive accompanist, he has been a core member of Diana Krall’s quartet since 2001, after joining her for a series of concerts in Paris at the Olympia Theater, which became the Grammy award winning recording and concert film *Live in Paris* (2002).

We offer a unique opportunity to experience world class musicians in an intimate and beautiful setting in our chancel. We do a little praying with an interfaith flavor, we hear a poem or a reading, we listen to a short meditation. But it’s all about the music. We ask our guest artists to play what they want to play, and they never disappoint.
